

INAUGURAL P20 LEGISLATIVE AGENDA Pre-Meeting Information for Council Review

Background/Context: The P20 Policies/Regulations Action Team has led the development of Legislative Priorities that the P20 Council will release, and has followed a comprehensive process to bring recommendations to you at our February 2, 2023 meeting. This process is detailed on pages 2-5 of this packet. These recommendations are separated by our four strategic directions/goals in the areas of: early education, K12 success, postsecondary success, and employee credential alignment.

Key Question:

How can the Land of Sky's leaders collectively advocate for long-term growth of successful strategies that lead to credential attainment?

Purpose: What current gap guides our work?

• There are a variety of serious regulatory barriers that impede growth along the educational continuum and the Land of Sky lacks a representative body to collectively advocate for changes that could positively impact educational attainment from early childhood through post-secondary environments.

Outcomes: How will our work be felt by the community?

• P20 will provide policy/regulatory recommendations, vetted by all members, to statewide partners and elected officials regarding chronic regulatory barriers that impede growth surrounding the four indicators of credential growth (early education enrollment, K12 success, postsecondary completion and employer credential alignment).

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Enhance Pre-K and Early Childhood Education programs' enrollment.

Strategic Goal

Increase enrollment of eligible children to 75% in each project county.

The P20 Policies/Regulations Action Team has led the development of Legislative Priorities that the P20 Council will release, and has followed a process detailed <u>here.</u> Their recommendations are as follows:

	POLICIES
1	Expand access to NC Pre-K (to all four-year-olds).*
2	Diversify the early childhood and higher education workforce.
	<u>STRATEGIES</u>
1	Expand the Child Care WAGE\$ program statewide in order to improve teacher recruitment and retention, stabilize the early education workforce, and support early educators who have or are working towards degrees in early education.
2	Increase the reimbursement rate to provide full funding for all NC Pre-K enrollees, to account for rising costs, and to incentivize four- and five-start centers that do not currently participate in NC Pre-K to do so and meet its higher-quality standards.
3	Provide transportation for NC Pre-K enrollees both in public and private settings.
4	Increase the reimbursement rate for administrative costs to 8% to support the true cost of providing NC Pre-K.
5	Increase licensed NC Pre-K teacher wages and benefits to achieve parity with K12 public school educators.

Improve student success rates in K-12 education.

Strategic Goal Increase graduation rate to 95% in each project county.

The P20 Policies/Regulations Action Team has led the development of Legislative Priorities that the P20 Council will release, and has followed a process detailed <u>here.</u> Their recommendations are as follows:

POLICIES

1	Develop the pipeline of highly qualified and well-prepared school leadersprincipals, assistant principals, and other administrators(with an emphasis on increasing diversity and on high-poverty and low-performing schools).*
2	Expand accessible, affordable, high-speed broadband throughout North Carolina (especially in rural and low-income areas).*
3	Increase funding for special education to promote recruitment and retention of highly qualified special education teachers and to ensure equitable access to education for students with disabilities.

STRATEGIES

- 1 Increase state funding for Specialized Instructional Support Personnel, or SISP (e.g., school counselors, nurses, social workers, and psychologists), enough to enable school districts to recruit highly qualified candidates by offering competitive compensation and benefits, and to begin to meet nationally recommended ratios.
- 2 To recruit and retain top talent, increase teachers' pay (to be above the national average and highest in the southeast, and to decrease the pay disparity between educators and similarly credentialed and experienced professionals in other fields), expand the Teaching Fellows program, and expand the Advanced Teaching Roles (ATR) program statewide.*
- Prioritize an investment in the science of reading in the early grades (K-3, PreK-5, or K-5), (including by fully funding Teaching Assistants for K-3 classrooms), (targeting first to high-need elementary schools or focusing particularly on students of color).*

Create a seamless transition to postsecondary education.

Strategic Goal

Improve postsecondary enrollment success to 65% in each project county.

The P20 Policies/Regulations Action Team has led the development of Legislative Priorities that the P20 Council will release, and has followed a process detailed <u>here.</u> Their recommendations are as follows:

	POLICIES	
1	Promote, expand, and provide equitable access to career and college readiness programs	
2	Help postsecondary students succeed in their educational attainment goals & provide funding for community colleges for mental health counselors, success coaches and student support services.	
	STRATEGIES	
1	Increase non-academic supports and services by connecting students to public benefits and resources on-campus and in their community to assist students facing non-academic challenges such as child care, transportation, mental health, and work demands.	
2	Remove barriers to postsecondary education access and attainment (for adult students, students of color, students who lack legal residency, rural students, and high school students in the CCP program).*	
3	Strengthen and align postsecondary and career advising, awareness, and preparation for students of all ages as they transition into postsecondary, whether from high school or from the workforce.	
4	Specifically target college advising, preparation, and enrollment efforts among underrepresented students (including low-income and first-generation-college high school students, students of color, disconnected youth, adults with some college but no degree, and students impacted by COVID-19 who are at risk of withdrawing or who have withdrawn).*	
5	Revise legislation to allow schools to align their schedules with their local community college to enable students to participate fully in the Career and College Promise program and take tuition-free college courses while in high school, as misaligned schedules present barriers for students who work when school is not in session and who depend on school busing and school lunch programs.

Strategic Goal

Ensure that 90% of North Carolina adults ages 25-44 in the labor force obtain the necessary credentials that align with needed employees' competencies.

The P20 Policies/Regulations Action Team has led the development of Legislative Priorities that the P20 Council will release, and has followed a process detailed <u>here.</u> Their recommendations are as follows:

POLICIES	
1	Expand and strengthen coordination between K-12, higher education, and industry/employers
2	Promote short-term and non-degree workforce training and pathways that lead to credentials aligned with in-demand, living-wage jobs.
3	Eliminate challenges and barriers in the educator pipeline.
	STRATEGIES
1	Ensure educational and training programs are aligned to the knowledge, skills, and competencies employers require and students need to succeed in high-wage, high-demand jobs.
2	Invest in the educator pipeline through increased pay for K-12, community college and UNC System instructional & student support positions.
3	Define, standardize, and incentivize short-term and non-degree workforce training and pathways that lead to credentials aligned with in-demand, living-wage jobs.
4	Fund alternative pathways-residencies, Grow-Your-Own programs, educator/student cadet programs, etcand revising licensing tests.
5	Launch a statewide communications and marketing campaign that emphasizes the economic value of industry-aligned postsecondary credentials and informs about the limits for people without degrees and certifications (by specifically targeting efforts toward recruiting teachers).*
6	Target expansion of workforce development programs in rural and economically disadvantaged areas.
