Component #1: ALL ABOUT THE AMBASSADORS!
We asked questions about their own personal insights,
life experiences and perceptions.

QUESTION (F): How can western NC educational leaders better support their students?

More youth leadership opportunities are needed for students that may not be as outgoing

Support groups for the academic and emotional needs of student immigrants, LGBTQIA+, would help tremendously.

Having an effective way and platform for students to provide consistent input to leadership on needed changes

Asking for input from students on what mental health resources are actually working and useful so that there is a feedback loop on what is important to keep/expand

Expanding the diversity of teachers/staff

Encouraging faculty to show compassion during life hardships happening in the students' lives

Recruitment for the Spring 2024 Student Ambassadors occurred in February and selections were made in March.


This new set of our Spring Ambassadors were given specific questions pertaining to their WNC learning journey, career interests, motivations, gaps in experiences/knowledge, etc.

Please introduce yourself and what you learned about your self and your peers as an Ambassador.


